Gartner Diaries



This is the diary of the travels of the Austrian Norbertine priest Father Maximilian Gaertner, O.Praem., of Wilten Abbey in Austria. Fr. Gaertner arrived in Wisconsin until recalled to Wilten Abbey in 1858. He worked primarily with another Norbertine of Wilten abbey, Father Adalbert Inama. Fr. Gaertner's diaries are an invaluable record of his travels and work in Wisconsin during these years. The letters of Fr. Inama are also available on Wisconsin Heritage Online.

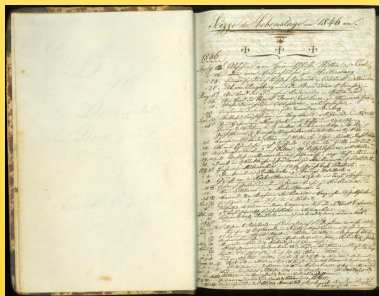
